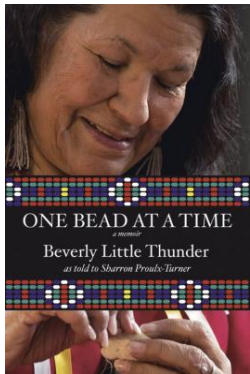
NEVER WITHOUT LOVE

 This is the story of a young girl born in Iran who eventually triumphs over sexism and abuse. Massoudi tackles a minefield of politics, from the regime of the Shah to foreign interests in Iran, to street marches and protests, to Ayatollah Khomeini and the Islamic Republic. Sexual politics and women's rights are addressed from the Persian custom of khastegari, to the stripping of women's rights under the Islamic Republic to domestic abuse in Canada.

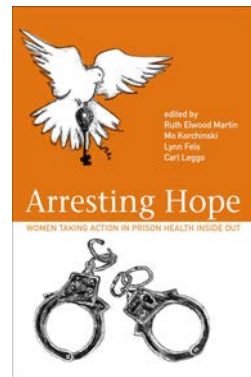
MIN FAMI

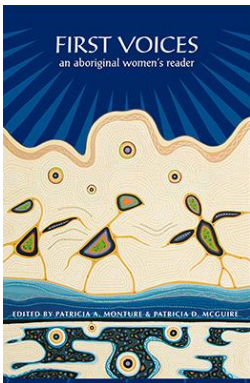
ONE BEAD AT A TIME

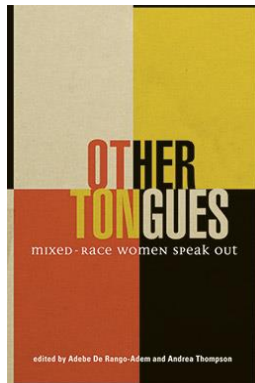
A ROMANI WOMEN'S ANTHOLOGY

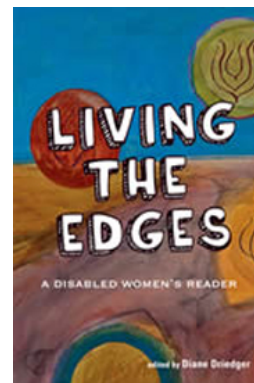
ARRESTING HOPE

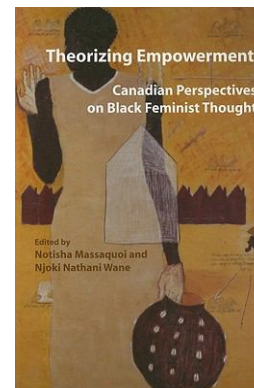
FIRST VOICES
